ORAL LANGUAGE/SPEECH REPORTS

REQUIRED

- 4 speeches (September May)
- Last Day for All Speeches: THURSDAY, MAY 9, 2019

OPTIONAL

- CERTIFICATE Award: 9 12 speeches (presented at the awards assembly)
- TROPHY Award: 13 speeches (presented at the awards assembly)

MANDATORY GUIDELINES

- 1. No more than one speech per week (exceptions upon teacher's approval).
- 2. **TYPED** copy of your speech is due the day of your speech presentation (printed by morning recess)
- 3. Speaker must use and prepare *index note-cards*:
 - *index cards must be in "caveman" talk
 - *index cards must be ready 2 school days in advance to speech date
 - *memorization is highly recommended, but reference to cards is okay
- 4. All speeches MUST be completed by _____ THURSDAY, MAY 9, 2019 ____.
- 5. Speeches should adhere to all listed requirements. If minimum requirements are not met, you will need to redo your speech.
- 6. Each speech must be practiced in advance (i.e. practice with a parent).
- 7. **Appropriate illustrations** include: **quality** hand-drawing in color, books, posters, Internet printouts, and graphics.
- 8. Speeches must be your own **ORIGINAL** work; plagiarized information will result in consequences.

REQUIRED

TRI 1 SPEECH 1

- speaker must tell about a personal experience
- speech must be one to two minutes long

TRI 2 SPEECH 2

- speaker must memorize and present the essay they wrote for their State Report Research Project
- in order to meet the time requirement, speech may be an edited/revised version from the original essay
- speaker must present their slideshow with a minimum of 6 slides (title slide, introduction slide, 3 subtopics slides, and concluding slide); think about Goldilocks for pictures & info
- speech must last between three to four minutes

TRI 3 SPEECH 3

- teacher will provide poems for the speaker to select and present
- speaker is expected to fully memorize the poem
- speaker must present poem with expressions and confidence
- · not timed

TRI 3 SPEECH 4

- speaker must become their famous American through costume and the use of body gestures
- speaker must use prop(s) during their speech
- speech must be two to three minutes long

EXTRAS

SPEECH 5

- speaker must share about an imaginary experience
- includes illustration (hand-drawn, computer generated, etc.)
- speech must be one to two minutes long

SPEECH 6

- speech must be informational
- speaker must include an appropriate illustration or diagram to show & explain during the presentation
- at the end of the speech, speaker must ask 5 questions to the audience to test how well the information was presented
- speech must be two to three minutes long

SPEECH 7

- speech must be about an imaginary invention
- explain why the invention is needed
- use, explain, and define 3 imaginary words in your speech (bold the 3 imaginary words in your essay)
- share a *quality drawing* or *model* of the invention and explain how it works
- speech must be two to three minutes long

SPEECH 8

- speaker must "sell" their Newbery Book
- display an original important scene with the main character (book jacket cover)
- summarize the book to include the beginning and middle; **not** giving away the ending
- Give at least 30 seconds of information about the author (i.e. where he/she lives, education, married, kids, etc.)
- speech must be two to three minutes long

SPEECH 9

- speaker must present information on a **famous** musician or artist
- speaker must display a picture of your famous person
- include, but not limited to: the person's background and several reasons why this person is well-known today
- speech must be two to three minutes long

SPEECH 10

- speaker must create a persuasive television commercial that persuades the audience to buy something they own
- speech should show-off your abilities of persuasion
- you must use **props** and be **dramatic** (watch/study infomercials and commercials)
- speech must be two to three minutes long

SPEECH 11

- speaker will act as a **news commentator** and report as though "you are there"
- the news should be about a <u>major event</u> that has occurred
- speech should give a detailed account of the event you are covering
- topic must be pre-approved by the teacher at least 3 days before speech presentation
- speech must be two to three minutes long

SPEECH 12

- speaker will act as a tour guide in a foreign country
- Include, but not limited to: the continent, population, 3 main cities, climate, main products, occupations, customs, homes, and the most interesting place to visit
- speaker must show a map of the country
- speaker **must** create a slideshow presentation
- speech must be three to four minutes long

SPEECH 13

- speech will be **imaginary**, but based on fact
- speaker will share what life will be like when they are
 65 years old
- include, but not limited to: what people are wearing, eating, where most of the people life, common jobs, types of transportation, and any other new things that you will find this far into the future
- also include: what you will be doing and where you will be living
- have fun and showcase your spectacular speaking skills! =)
- speech must be four to five minutes long
